Below are some activities to support your child in developing key skills in spelling, punctuation and grammar.

To spell words correctly containing the 40+ phonemes already taught (see chart)	Name the letters of the alphabet in and out of order	To learn how to write a statement, question, exclamation and command
To spell correctly the Year 2 Common Exception Words (see chart)	To form lower case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place, of the correct size and relative to each other  To form capital letters  To form digits 0-9 (see chart)	To write expanded noun phrases (adjective + noun)
